

PHILIPPINES - Apples

Phytosanitary Certificate (PC) and Import Permit (IP) are required.

Do not certify unless an IP is presented.

Additional Declaration is required. See IP for current AD.

DO NOT USE THIS AD IF IT IS NOT THE SAME AS WRITTEN ON THE IP THAT IS PRESENTED.

Mediterranean fruit fly (*Ceratitis capitata*), Mexican Fruit Fly (*Anastrepha ludens*) and West Indian Fruit Fly (*Anastrepha obliqua*) does not occur in the State of Washington. Philippine Plant Protection Service import number _____ was presented.

Additional Information

- Additional Declaration that "Philippine Plant Protection Service import number (???) was presented."
- All containers must be shipped under either packing house or shipping line seals.
- The ocean freight container number(s) and corresponding seal number(s) must be listed on the phytosanitary certificate under "Distinguishing Marks".
- Please inform shippers that the container number(s) and corresponding seal number(s) must appear on the shipping documents, including the Inward Cargo Manifest and Bill of Lading. All unused space on the PC must be lined out.
- Shipments of fresh fruits from the U.S. could transit Hong Kong, Taiwan, etc., en route to the Philippines. Exporters must be advised that breakage of container seals before verification by Philippine Plant Quarantine officials on arrival could subject the shipment to return to place of origin, re-export or destruction with all expenses borne by the importer/exporter.
