

LEGAL ISSUES IN TODAY'S JAIL

March 26–28, 2012 ● Kitsap, Washington

This three-day seminar addresses key legal issues facing jails today as well as Supreme Court decisions of the last 12 months. The most recent court rulings are explained with an emphasis on how they affect jail management. Participants learn how to protect themselves and their facility.

Participants can apply 24 points toward the AJA Certified Jail Manager Program. CEUs are available through Fort Hayes State University.

Who should participate?

Mid- to upper-level managers such as sheriffs, jail administrators, deputy administrators, personnel managers, supervisors, training officers, and compliance officers.

At the conclusion of this program, participants are able to:

- Understand and apply the latest Congressional case law (standards) to evaluate institutional policies and procedures that address prisoner rights under the 1st, 4th, 8th, and 14th Amendments to the U.S. Constitution including:
 - Freedom of speech (e.g., mail, telephone, visitation, news media).
 - Free exercise of religion.
 - Access to courts and counsel.
 - Search and seizure.
 - Cross-gender supervision.
 - Medical and mental health care.
 - Duty to protect.
 - Conditions of confinement.
 - In-custody deaths.
 - Use of force.
- Understand and apply the latest Congressional legislation to assess institutional policies and procedures (e.g., RLUIPA; PLRA; PREA).
- Develop practical strategies to avoid or defend the jail facility in litigation.
 - Civil liability.
 - Prison Litigation Reform Act.
- Apply effective methods to respond in a proactive manner to legal issues in jails.

Carrie Hill is an attorney and criminal justice consultant who has been actively involved in corrections for over 20 years. After leaving her position as General Counsel for the Utah Department of Corrections, Ms. Hill has focused on providing training and consulting for a variety of private and public entities on national, regional, State, and local levels.
