Workshop Description:

This 16 hour interactive workshop is facilitated by law enforcement executives experienced in the implementation of DDACTS. Attendees will actively work together to learn and apply the DDACTS Guiding Principles. They will generate an action plan that can be applied in their respective jurisdictions.

DDACTS is a law enforcement operational model proven to generate significant reductions in traffic crashes and crime, therefore reducing social harms and increasing the quality of life in local communities. Moreover, these positive outcomes can be generated with existing law enforcement resources.

There are no registration fees for this workshop and attendees will receive 16 hours of credit towards their annual 24 hour in-service training requirement. This includes a workshop certificate of completion.

We ask each participating agency to commit to send at least one commander, usually the rank of captain or above, one supervisor, usually a lieutenant or sergeant with front line supervision and deployment responsibilities and an analyst or someone who will be assigned the data and analysis responsibilities. The attendees will participate in discipline-specific breakout groups during which they will discuss the roles and responsibilities related to DDACTS implementation and long-term sustainability.

The groups are led by DDACTS subject matter experts from around the country who work for and/or support agencies that have implemented DDACTS and have achieved dramatic results. The workshop is appropriate for agencies large or small, urban or rural and with or without current data-driven capabilities. In addition to the facilitated discussions, brainstorming and networking offered through the workshop, participants are also invited to make use of a wide range of free, follow-up technical assistance in support of DDACTS implementation. The support will be customized to each agency's specific needs.

Attendance is limited to the first 10 agencies to register for the workshop. Based on demand, future DDACTS workshops will be schedule to accommodate those unable to attend this first session.
