





Documenting Bullet Defects for Shooting Scene Reconstructions



This course is intended to teach the student how to measure, document and photograph bullet defects in non-vehicle structures. The data collected can then be used in the reconstruction process whether by the same person or a trained reconstructionist. Included with tuition is a basic trajectory documentation kit.

Our Instructor:

Don Ledbetter is a Seattle Police Detective with over 20 years experience as an investigator. He is one of the original members of SPD's Crime Scene Investigations Unit, and has investigated hundreds of shooting scenes and over 30 officer-involved shootings. He received a Bachelor's in Engineering, and has been recognized as a Certified Senior Crime Scene Analyst by the International Association for Identification.

Don has taught courses on trajectory analysis, crime-scene mapping, Total Station, and crime scene investigation to audiences ranging from WA CJTC and the Violent Crimes Investigators' Association to the Seattle FBI Evidence Response Team.

This course is based on his practical, real-world experience in documenting and analyzing bullet defects to determine trajectory, shooter positions, and sequence of shots. Even if you will not be the one doing the shooting reconstruction, this course will give you the tools and techniques to properly and completely document the scene for later analysis and reconstruction. The class will include lecture, demonstration, and hands on practical exercises on actual bullet defects using the tools you will take back with you.

Documenting Bullet Defects for Shooting Scene Reconstructions

Tuition: The cost for this course is \$100 for WHIA members, \$125 for non-members, which includes a 2013 WHIA membership. Included is coffee & snacks for breaks, lunch, parking, a 10+ piece bullet defect documentation tool kit, and a certificate of completion.
