Drug endangered children are children who are at risk of suffering physical and/or emotional harm as a result of their parents' and/or guardians' illegal drug use, possession, manufacturing, cultivation or distribution, including the illegal use of prescription drugs.

Learning Objectives:

1. Identify the risks and actual dangers that illegal drug activities present to children.
2. Describe the long-term needs of drug endangered children.
3. Outline the broad concepts of a collaborative response.
4. Explain the advantages presented by a collaborative response in sustaining DEC efforts and engendering broad change in community norms.
