Students are occasionally impacted by alcohol and other drugs, which affects their ability to perform successfully in school as well as causes disruption to the educational environment. Many educators have limited knowledge of how to detect student substance abuse or deter students from using substances.

Intended to guide anyone working in an education setting, this comprehensive one-day course will help participants deter and detect substance abuse. In addition, it is designed to help them effectively intervene when a student is suspected of alcohol or drug use.

Attendees will learn common drugs being used by students today and their effects on the body; ways of detecting substance use and abuse; medical issues; drug paraphernalia and how students 'hide' their use; rules and regulations pertaining to alcohol and other drugs; questioning methods and sobriety tests; and other related topics.

Master Police Officer Michael Graddon, M.Ed. is a certified drug recognition expert with training in drug evaluation and classification and drug law enforcement training. He serves with the Des Moines Police Department.
