DESCRIPTION:

APS is designed for police helicopter units. The police function differs from military and civilian operations, since the primary function is to locate and arrest criminal suspects.

The class focuses on locating and arresting suspects, either by the air crew or by directing ground troops. However, the high possibility exists that suspects may open fire on the helicopter, endangering crews and the aircraft. Officers aboard must be able to effectively shoot from a moving helicopter, in a variety of positions, to stop the threat on the ground.

The student will learn to secure himself to the aircraft; weapon and optic selection; shooting from a moving platform (negative lead); contact, land, and arrest; contact/hover/cover; shooting at various angles and speeds, and other topics.

The class will be taught by Jeff Hall and Chris Hays of Helo-Gunners. Both are military and law enforcement veterans, and are the only two police victors in air-to-ground combat.

REQUIREMENTS: a select-fire rifle or submachine gun (the M-16/M-4 platform preferred); 1,000 rounds of ammunition; a rappel harness, carabineer, ten feet of nylon webbing, and normal range gear. Recommended: a Nomex uniform, like the Blackhawk ITS, Nomex gloves, and Nomex balaclava.

The course will begin in the classroom and move to the range on Day 1. Lecture and practice shooting with negative lead will be covered. Days 2 and 3 will begin at the SCSO Hangar and move to a ranch west of Spokane for the practical portion. Directions to these areas will be provided on the first day. There will be significant flying time involved, upwards of 7 hours per day.
