INSTRUCTOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT & CERTIFICATION

Course Description:

This course will introduce the Law Enforcement Firearm Instructor to a set of effective fundamental concepts that will facilitate shooting skill development. Practical Edge Instructor students will learn the methods needed to transfer these fundamental concepts and skills to others, along with a model of how to train others in the tactical application of those skills.

The student's knowledge, shooting, and training skill level will be increased through an intensive, dynamic, and progressive training format. Students will develop their shooting skill to a level where they can demonstrate "on-demand" a proficiency of shooting that is effective in deadly force combat, where both accuracy and time are of consequence.

The 6 days of instruction will be uncomplicated, while based on the realities of what is actually needed to win gunfights. Training will employ a methodology of skill development not traditionally taught. Students who are obtaining their initial instructor certification, along with those who attend for updated certification training, will find the information presented to be realistic and effective in developing the shooting skills of others.

Instructor certification will be based on student's performance throughout class to include testing. Students will be required to sign a liability waiver at start of training. Students committing safety violations will be excused from further training with no refund of tuition.
