About the instructor: Chief Deputy (Retired) Rod Englert, a 46-year veteran of law enforcement, retired as Commander of the Operations Division, Multnomah County Sheriff's Office, Portland, Oregon, in 1995. He started his career with the Downey, California Police Department after graduating from the Los Angeles Police Academy. In 1969 Chief Deputy Englert moved to Portland, Oregon and joined the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office. A large portion of Chief Deputy Englert's career has been associated with working major crimes, narcotics and homicide. His expertise is in the area of homicide crime scene reconstruction and blood spatter interpretation. Rod Englert received a Bachelor's degree in Police Administration from California State University at Los Angeles. He is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, where he was President of the 159th Session. Chief Deputy Englert has conducted over 550 lectures and training seminars on managing criminal investigations, solving unresolved homicides, blood spatter interpretation and crime scene reconstruction to law enforcement personnel, district attorneys and private attorneys in 35 states as well as in Canada, Russia, England, France, and South America. He has consulted in over 400 homicides in the United States and Canada. He has testified and is a qualified court expert in crime scene reconstruction and blood pattern analysis in 26 states. Englert is a member of the International Homicide Investigator's Association; several states' Homicide Investigator's Associations; a Fellow, Distinguished Member, President (2001/2002), and Chairman of the Board (2002-2003) of the Association of Crime Scene Reconstructionists; a Fellow in the American Academy of Forensic Sciences; and is Past-President of the International Association of Blood Pattern Analysts. He has received the Lecturer of Merit and Distinguished Faculty Awards from the National College of District Attorneys. Rod Englert is the author of *Blood Secrets: A Forensic Expert Reveals How Blood Spatter Tells The Crime Scene's Story* (Thomas Dunne Books/St. Martin's Press, 2010). Part autobiography and part casebook, *Blood Secrets* has earned praise from such respected sources as *Publishers Weekly*, which dubbed it “a fascinating journey into the study of crimson drops....deftly balancing real-life examples and scientific analysis.”

Course Description: This presentation will acquaint the investigator with techniques that can be utilized at violent crime scenes and will enhance the solvability factor, especially if we recognize "What Isn't So."

In addition to a psychological crime scene assessment, other considerations are: the use of Alternate Light Sources, Luminol, aspects of gunshot wounds, and blood patterns related to reconstruction. The lecture consists of slides and video of pertinent homicide cases related to the topic "Crime Scene Assessment." Examples of staged and manipulated scenes will be shown involving the "Little Devil in the Details" that changed the course of the investigations. That will transition into the session related to "Courtroom Preparation and Testimony."
