- To work toward lasting solutions for people who are experiencing a mental crisis.
- To understand the mental health system and how to best interact with it.

CIT training provides first responders with the skills to make a safer intervention for themselves, the consumer **[the subject]** in a crisis, the consumer's family, and the community. First responders will be trained in:

- Available "tools" useful in contacting people who are in mental crisis.
- De-escalation techniques specific to mental health crisis situations.
- Recognition of medications commonly associated with.
