### **FINDING CONCEALED COMPARTMENTS: CRIMINAL CONCEALMENT TECHNIQUES Concealed Compartments and Traps**

Drug traffickers and other criminals have increasingly utilized simple and complex concealment techniques to hide the fruits, evidence and instrumentalities of their crimes. This course will provide information on common concealment methods utilized in vehicles, residences, furniture and commercial locations, including sophisticated electronic traps. The course is designed to educate all law enforcement officers, including prosecutors, local and state patrol officers and investigative personnel, highway patrol officers, drug unit investigators and asset seizure investigators regarding concealment techniques utilized by criminal organizations. This course has something for everyone, whether you are an experienced investigator or just out of the academy.

#### **Course Information:**

This one-day course will cover vehicle concealed compartments with special attention to concealed gun compartments, compartments used to transport money, personal versus transport traps, triggering devices and indicators, trap locations and special vehicle modifications, residential concealed compartments, concealed compartments in furniture, hidden locations in apartments and houses as well as hiding areas versus concealed compartments. The course will also cover booby-trapped hidden compartments and other related safety issues. To register for the class, fax the Registration to Special Agent Tony Stapleton at 206/281-5245.
