More on the Instructor: Jack H. Schonely's began his law enforcement career with the Berks County Sheriff's Office in Pennsylvania. In 1983, he joined the Los Angeles Police Department. He has been a patrol officer, Field Training Officer and undercover vice officer. After working Hollywood Vice, Jack Schonely transferred to the LAPD's premier tactical unit, Metropolitan Division. In Metropolitan Division Jack Schonely worked a variety of details, including city-wide crime suppression, surveillance, VIP security and crowd control.

In 1992, Jack Schonely became a K-9 handler in Metropolitan Division where he conducted over 700 high risk searches. A few years later he became a Tactical Flight Officer with LAPD's Air Support Division coordinating tactical operations on a nightly basis. Many of these incidents involved foot pursuits and perimeter containments. He was the Chief Tactical Flight Officer before he switched seats in the helicopter and was selected as a Command Pilot at Air Support where he is still assigned. He is a Certified Flight Instructor in rotorcraft. Jack was the recipient of the 2004 Air Crew of the Year Award at LAPD Air Support. Jack Schonely also has a BS in criminal justice.

Jack Schonely is the author of *Apprehending Fleeing Suspects; Suspect Tactics and Perimeter Containment*.
