The first section will explore the general concepts and strategies of CPTED. The second section will examine the application of principles to schools and conducting a school safety & security assessment based upon the principles of CPTED.

### *Trainer Biographies:*

#### **Randal Town, M.Ed.**

For the past 23 years Randy has worked in the area of school crisis management and safety. He provides crisis management, and school safety training – which includes site safety assessments built upon the principals of CPTED. In addition he provides technical assistance and related crisis response services across the state (of WA); he has traveled nationally and internationally providing crisis management training for school districts. He developed the “Regional Crisis Response Team” in conjunction with all public schools within ESD 105. He is the co-developer, and co-author of **Quick Response, A Step-by-Step Guide to Crisis Management for Principals, Counselors and Teachers**. Randy is currently a 17 year veteran of the Yakima County Sheriff’s Office as a Reserve Deputy and holds the rank of Sergeant. Randy has received basic and advanced CPTED training from nationally renowned experts Timothy Crowe and Art Hushen; in addition Randy has conducted assessments of schools and colleges around the State of Washington. Randy is a recipient of the Yakima County Medal of Valor.

#### **Ben Hittle**

Ben is currently the Director of Security at Pacific Northwest University of Health Sciences. He comes from a law enforcement background spanning 33 years in the Yakima Valley. Ben served as a Field Training Officer while on patrol. He graduated from Backster School of Lie Detection and served as a polygraph examiner for Yakima Police Department. In Special Operations, Ben most recently was assigned to the Central Business District and Transit Center along with substituting as a School Resource Officer. During this period he attended basic and advanced CPTED. Ben was a founding member of the Western States Hostage Negotiators Association. He is an active member and past State Representative of the Western Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators, and Washington State Crime Prevention Association. He is a past YMCA and YPAL board member. He is currently on the board of Yakima County Crime Stoppers and the International Footprinters Association. Ben received the Yakima Police Medal of Valor in 1975, YPD 20 year SWAT Service Award, and the YPD Certificate of Excellence award. Ben is a native of Yakima, having grown up and attended Union Gap, Eisenhower HS, and Yakima Valley College.
