Ongoing acts of targeted violence in the United States and Canada reinforce the need for law enforcement, educators and mental health professionals to have an understanding of threat assessment and threat management to protect lives and avoid civil litigation.

Most cases of targeted violence have been shown to be predictable and preventable. Threat assessment and threat management have been shown to be effective processes which not only identify a subject at risk but also can provide management strategies to maximize their safety.
