PROGRAM HISTORY

The Kiwanis Law Enforcement Youth Camp was originally established in 1970 for high school students who think they might be interested in a law enforcement career, through the efforts of Indiana Kiwanian Erine Alder, who was a state policeman by profession. The first camp in our Pacific Northwest Kiwanis District was held in 1977.

The statistics of the original program are impressive, as well as rewarding. Out of the original 1977 class, 20 of the 81 camp graduates became police officers, and another 30 began studying criminal justice.

A Washington camp survey indicated almost 80% of the graduates have entered some area of law enforcement as a career.

As law enforcement agencies are finding it more and more difficult to recruit employees, this also provides a public service to the community by encouraging youth to work in the public safety arena.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The Washington Kiwanis Youth Law Enforcement Career Camp is a joint effort by Kiwanians and the Washington State Patrol, together with other local, state and federal law enforcement agencies. It provides selected high school juniors and seniors with a one-week experience that is oriented towards a program of the basic elements, responsibilities, and mechanics of the law enforcement system. Emphasis is placed on the role of the police officer in that system.

PARTICIPATION, RECRUITMENT, AND QUALIFICATIONS

It is the responsibility of the participating clubs to sponsor the participants.

Local clubs should contact high school counselors and local law enforcement agencies to suggest possible applicants.

Applicants are charged a \$50 non-refundable application fee. The student is responsible for contacting a local Kiwanis club and arranging for a \$500 camp scholarship.



QUALIFICATIONS FOR STUDENTS

1. Currently enrolled in high school, preferable as a junior or senior.
2. Has shown and expressed interest in one of the various fields of law enforcement.
3. Sound moral character—no criminal record.
4. **Good academic record— 2.5 cumulative GPA or above—and be recommended by two teachers.**
5. Good physical health and able to participate in vigorous activities.
6. Have parents permission.
7. Provide photo identification.

WSP IS HIRING NOW!

WSP Cadet Testing Unit is Now Accepting Online Applications. Effective September 1, 2013, the WSP no longer accepts paper applications. The WSP Cadet Testing Unit will be transitioning to online applications using NEOGOV at careers.wa.gov. All applicants are subject to personal background evaluations, including a polygraph examination, because of the nature of the work and security requirements.

Here you can find information about the standards for all civilian and commissioned career opportunities that exist within the Washington State Patrol. Some requirements are:

Have no tattoos, body art, branding, or voluntary disfigurement that is visible while on duty. Visible areas include lower portion of the upper arms, elbows, the entire forearms, hands, neck and facial areas. Body modifications and body art listed above shall either be removed or covered completely and opaquely while in a short sleeve uniform

Drug possession/usage beyond some standards disqualifies you for employment with the Washington State Patrol.

“Possession” is defined as having actual physical control of any illegal (non-prescribed) drug for personal use or otherwise.

“Use” is defined as: trying, testing, or experimenting, which includes, but is not limited to tasting, smoking, injecting, absorbing, sniffing, or inhaling.

If required by the position description, the applicant must possess a current, non-probationary, and non-restricted valid driver’s license.

Have no felony convictions.

No DUI’s regardless of time frame and age. Which will also include reduced charges.
