Research indicates people with autism are seven times more likely to be in contact with law enforcement. The Autism Alliance of Michigan's MAST goal is to increase autism education of law enforcement and Emergency Responders and to reduce liability. The objectives of this training for Emergency Responders is to 1) expand their knowledge of autism and autistic behaviors 2) increase recognition skills of persons with autism 3) acquire information and tips on how to safely and effectively interact with individuals with autism and their family/care providers 4) learn community outreach strategies to increase safety and support of those with autism.
