

2 Day Mountain Bike Skills Clinic

A two-day mountain bike clinic designed specifically for the bike patrol officer. This clinic will improve and enhanced officer's bike handling skills, enabling officers to focus on patrol duties. Officers will participate in skill-building drills in both an urban and off road environment. The class is based on IMIC (International Mountain Bike Instructor Certifications) now under IMBA criteria, with added insight and feedback from Illinois State University Police.
