



Course Description

With the current upward trend of Hash Oil explosions, this class has been designed to cover the dangers associated with Hash Oil manufacturing for both law enforcement and fire personnel. Students will learn about the manufacturing process, explosion hazards for first responders and tips associated with investigating these incidents.



Butane Hash Oil Explosions Training

With the greater availability of marijuana around the country and State of Colorado and Washington, connoisseurs of marijuana have found new ways to extract THC for even greater highs. One of these methods is the Butane Hash Oil (BHO) process. By introducing butane into the extraction process, the end result can be deadly. BHO labs are exploding and causing injuries throughout the nation, particularly in regions with very little marijuana laws. BHO labs have their own unique set of investigative techniques: from safe handling of the scene, to evidence collection, to prosecution after an explosion.

- Understand the process of how butane hash oil is made.
- Learn the history of BHO and other types of hashish extraction.
- Have an understanding of THC content and how it relates to being high
- Learn the dangers of these types of labs and the tasks needed to be completed for an investigation and prosecution.
- Know what needs to be included in an affidavit for search warrant and how it apply's to 1st and 4th degree arson.
