This training will empower you to effectively communicate, appropriately respond to, and ultimately survive a Violent Intruder Event for yourself and those in your care. What you will learn will allow you to minimize the negative impact on the facility and people, and preserve human life.
- We will inform you as to what you can expect in the police response to a Violent Intruder Event and what you can do support the evacuation and life-saving steps.
- Finally, we will help you identify strategic areas and functions that must be established to provide ongoing support during the aftermath of a Violent Intruder Event.
