Before joining Centralia College full time, he was president and general manager for Martin Sand and Gravel Co. in south Thurston County, and previously worked as an attorney.

Chris holds a Juris Doctorate from the University Of Washington School Of Law and a bachelor's degree in business administration from Western Washington University.

Chris developed and implemented a very successful leadership development program that he facilitates each academic year to teams, comprised of staff and faculty, from Centralia College, Grays Harbor College, Lower Columbia College, and South Puget Sound College.
