



Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) Instructor Development

Washington State Patrol Impaired Driving Section Drug Evaluation and Classification Program

The Drug Evaluation and Classification (DEC) Program is seeking interested applicants to increase the state's cadre of SFST instructors. These instructors will be trained and qualified to teach the DUI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing curriculum. They do **not** have to attend Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) School as a prerequisite. SFST instructors will be responsible to assist with the instruction of the full three day NHTSA DUI Detection and SFST course, the four hour SFST refresher, and 40 hour SFST Instructor Development courses that will be offered around the state.

Application Requirements:

- ◆ Completed [SFST Instructor Development School Application](#) (listed under SFST training)
- ◆ Command level letter of recommendation supporting application
- ◆ City/County Prosecutor letter of recommendation
- ◆ Include a curriculum vitae, to areas of interest relating to DUI/SFST
- ◆ If currently a DRE, please provide last three years Rolling Logs (2012, 2013, and 2014)

Minimum Qualifications:

- ◆ Demonstrate excellent public speaking ability and verbal instruction skills
- ◆ Ability to write and communicate clearly
- ◆ Ability to follow direction and instruct a standardized curriculum
- ◆ Ability to create and maintain partnerships with other agencies
- ◆ Display excellent work habits and time management characteristics
- ◆ Successful completion of the 24 hour NHTSA DUI Detection and SFST course
- ◆ Successful completion of the 16 hour Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) course
- ◆ Hold a current BAC operator's permit
