Who Should Attend

State, local, and tribal patrol and street-level law enforcement officers as well as court officials/officers and analytical personnel assigned to a unit with responsibilities in the area of information gathering and/or investigation of terrorism and criminal extremism will benefit from this training. The course topic will provide a thorough review of a sovereign citizen encounter in West Memphis, Arkansas, on May 20, 2010, as well as address the basic beliefs of sovereign citizens and the threats that the criminal extremist element of sovereign citizens present to law enforcement officers. Extensive coverage will be afforded to indicators that law enforcement officers can observe and hear to better enable them to recognize sovereign citizens and determine the level of threat.

Mr. Robert H. Paudert, Retired Chief, West Memphis, Arkansas, Police Department, will present instruction on Understanding the Sovereign Citizen Threat.
