- Managing multi-jurisdictional tactical knowledge bases
- Managing containment for fugitive/recovery operations
- Managing non-organic tactical assets
- Air-Ground operations and control
- Intelligence gathering



Use of Force/Tactical

- Use of force and tactical decision-making
- Weapons retention/active countermeasures
- Practical concepts for K9 operations
- Small unit tactics for rural environments
- Land navigation, terrain profiling and association



Crime Scene Management

- Crime scene processing and interpretation
- Footwear and tire impression documentation and collection
- Fixing, documenting and collecting evidence in remote environments

This course will include limited pre-work, a written exam and culminate in a final field training exercise that will test the student's knowledge of all the classes that have been taught during the training. This course is based in part on the successes of project Green Seal, a multi-jurisdictional training program culminating in a multi-county joint operation, which used the attendees of this course as the first responders and tactical decision-makers to a complex and broad tactical problem.
