There is also an “Executive Track”, specifically for agency leaders to learn how to develop collaborative programs. The keynote speaker for the Together Everyone Achieves More (TEAM) conference is Dale McFee, Deputy Minister of Corrections and Policing from Saskatchewan, Canada. McFee will discuss the lessons learned from their “HUB” program, a federal level collaborative effort.
