



**Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission Basic Law  
Enforcement Equivalency Academy (0090-4)

**PRE-ACADEMY INSTRUCTIONS**

- Arrival:** Attendees are to report at **8:00 AM** on **Monday, April 25, 2016** to the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission at 19010 1st Ave. S., Burien WA 98148 for course orientation.
- Attire:** **Please wear their agency's regular-issue patrol/duty uniform throughout the academy, including duty belt and weapon. Please bring appropriate workout clothing to be used during Defensive Tactics.**
- Attendance:** Attendees will be expected to attend the full Equivalency Academy session.
- Travel:** Travel will be the responsibility of the attendee or his/her department.
- Lodging & Meals:** Academy students whose home agency is in **excess** of forty (40) miles, as computed by the Commission, from the Criminal Justice Training Center are considered non-commuting attendees. These students are therefore eligible to receive full meal service and lodging as provided by the WSCJTC, as outlined in RCW 43.101.200 (2). *"Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, the commission shall provide the aforementioned training together with necessary facilities, supplies, materials, and the board and room of non-commuting attendees for seven days per week."*

Full meal services will be provided to the eligible live-in recruits. Please note: Dinner will be served *if* the applicant checked-in the night before the start of the Academy followed by breakfast, lunch & dinner on each full day of class. The same will apply for the final day, unless otherwise noted. If an eligible student declines live-in status, or wishes to make alternative arrangements, such as residing with family or friend, the WSCJTC must be notified as early as possible and before Academy attendance.

**Linens will be provided; however, applicants are required to provide their own towels, laundry soap, and toiletries.**

Recruits lodging at the Academy are required to check in at the reception desk one day prior to the first day of class at 1400 hrs. If you are unable to check in at this time, please contact the BLEA Registrar at (206) 835-7299 or via email at [blearegistrar@cjtc.state.wa.us](mailto:blearegistrar@cjtc.state.wa.us) by **1600 hrs.** on the Thursday prior to check-in.
