



# Law Enforcement First Responder Training Program

## Program Focus:

The Law Enforcement First Responder Training Program is a 3-day classroom-based training program that covers the topics most applicable to law enforcement officers as first responders. Law enforcement officers must be trained and equipped to respond to virtually any situation, including criminal acts, terrorist attacks and other large-scale emergencies. These officers will need to use a system of command to achieve a coordinated and effective incident response. This program will provide training, guidelines and resources to address these, as well as other important issues and is designed for law enforcement officers and law enforcement support personnel. The practical application of sound response principles is a main theme of this training program.

## Training Topics Include:

- Pre-Attack Behavior and Violence Prevention
- Crisis Intervention Communication and Management
- Active Threat Response Tactics
- Tactical Medical
- Weapons of Mass Destruction
- First Responder/Incident Command System
- HAZMAT Awareness

**Who Should Attend:** Qualified applicants must be sworn state, local or tribal law enforcement officers.

**Cost: TUITION-FREE** (Attendees are responsible for all travel, lodging and meal expenses.)
