Investigating these high liability and deadly crimes pose new challenges that cannot be ignored. The impact of DV crime is far reaching and leaves children and families with generation-crossing scars and damage. This presentation will take an in-depth look at the importance of understanding and investigating these crimes, increased education for investigators and first responders as well as the impact on victims and the long-term impact on communities. Case studies will include homicide, stalking and assault investigation.

Joining Cpl. McGuire is nationally recognized DV stalking survivor, Sheri O'Neil, who suffered a life changing ordeal at the hands of her abuser who used sophisticated technology to stalk her and her children.
