



Archer-MFG Law Enforcement Armorers Course

Kent Police Department will be hosting Archer MFG's Law Enforcement Armorers Course from June 27-28th at the Kent PD Range. Synopsis:

Archer MFG has a very diagnostic end user focused approach to weapons, taught by two experienced and certified Gunsmiths with varied backgrounds. One is a custom Gunsmith with years of manufacturing firearms and ammunition from stock materials. The other is a gunsmith with years of experience as an LE armorer both at the Depot Level repair shop, and as a firearms instructor providing field armorer in support of live fire training.

The Archer Course will cover more than the standard assembly and disassembly of the AR pattern rifle. Students will be introduced to a more in depth diagnostic approach to inspection, gauging, and repair techniques. More importantly, students will walk away with a more realistic understanding of their scope of work and subsequent liabilities. All aspects of the course are related back to the end user armorer in a linear approach, start to finish. Where lines typically blur around subjects such as armorer interaction with end users, peers, management, and the manufacturer; Archer MFG seeks to build armorers capable of serving as a conduit which increases the information exchange, while optimizing the service life of agency issued or authorized firearms.
