Student Instructions

Participants are requested to report on **Monday, August 22, 2010**, at **7:45 AM** to the **Spokane Police Firing Range** at **2302 North Waterworks** in **Spokane, WA**. Class times will be from 8 AM -5 PM daily. There will be **one** evening session required for a night shooting class. Schedules will be available on the first day of class.

Lodging, Travel, and Meals: Travel and meals will be the responsibility of the participant or his or her agency. **There will be no reimbursement for expenses.**

Costs: Agencies will be billed \$500 after the course is completed. **Note:** If the agency fails to cancel this application or the applicant is a "no-show," the agency **will be** charged \$500.

Cancellation Guidelines: In order to avoid being charged the full course fee, applications must be canceled via email blearegistrar@cjtc.state.wa.us no later than **August 15, 2011**. No exceptions will be made.

Attire: Suitable clothing for range during fair or inclement weather. Boots are recommended. Field dress and rain gear will be necessary for outside training which begins on the first day of class.

Attendance: **Absenteeism is not acceptable in this course.** Time loss or absences will not be excused during this course and will be grounds for dismissal from the course. Please cancel your position in the class if you anticipate missing any part of the school. Certificates of completion will be awarded to those participants who successfully complete the course requirements.

Emergency Contact: Attendees should advise their families and department of how to reach them in the event of an emergency. **Emergency number: 253-591-5919**

Required Course Work: This is a pass/fail course. Attendees will be required to teach a short class, pass a written exam, demonstrate safety with all of your firearms, and shoot passing scores on various courses of fire. You will not receive a certificate if you fail any one of the requirements.

Participants will find that course work and reading after class is necessary, and we recommend that long commutes or night shift work be avoided during the course.

Documents: The following documents are **REQUIRED:**

- Department firearms policies
- Use of lethal force policy
- Manufacturer's operator manual for rifle
- Manufacturer's operator manual for optic

Liability Release: All participants, as a condition of course attendance and participation, will be required to sign a liability release. If the participant does not bring the form with thme, additional forms will be available on the first day at the beginning of class.

Ammo: The following ammunition is **REQUIRED**:

- ☞ 500 rifle rounds
- ☞ 10 dummy rifle rounds
- ☞ 50 duty handgun rounds

Equipment Needs: The following equipment is **REQUIRED for EACH student**:

1. Agency rifle – with agency optics and iron sights or just iron sights, sling (recommend tactical), optional light mount. Those with optics mounted on an AR flattop receiver need to bring the iron-sighted carry handle as well. All applicants should consider bringing a duplicate spare rifle.
2. Spare rifle magazine carrier (either belt or weapon mounted)
3. Minimum of three rifle magazines
4. Dummy training rifle with sling (red or blue plastic – ASP or Ring's)
5. Duty handgun and Patrol duty belt with a minimum of three magazines
6. Dummy training pistol to fit duty holster (red or blue gun)
7. Eye protection (including clear glasses for night firing)
8. Hearing protection – electronic headphones and earplugs
9. One duty flashlight and one backup
10. Weapon cleaning equipment
11. BDU type pants with cargo pockets
12. Clipboard with waterproof cover
13. Whistle and stopwatch or watch with second hand
14. Pencils and pens
15. Baseball cap
16. Body armor

Optional (recommended)

1. Rain poncho/parka
2. Water bottle
3. Knee pads
4. Elbow pads
5. Laptop computer
