### **SWAT Basic (0510-1)** *Student Instructions*

**October 2 – 7, 2011**  
**Kennewick, WA**

Participants are requested to report, **in athletic type clothing ready to take the SWAT PAT**, on **Sunday, October 2, 2011**, to the **Richland HS Gym at 930 Long Avenue, Richland, WA 99352**, in at **11:00 AM** for the first day. Class hours vary daily.

**Lodging, Travel, and Meals:** Travel and meals will be the responsibility of the participant or his or her agency. **There will be no reimbursement for expenses.**

**Prerequisites:** Must be a current member of SWAT team, proficient with intermediate rifle or (SMG) and handgun. Must also meet WASPC Physical Fitness standards to gain entry to the course: 35 push-ups, 35 sit-ups, 6 pull-ups, and complete 1.5 mile run in 12:30 or less. **Costs:** Agencies will be billed \$600 after the course is completed.

**Cancellation Guidelines:** In order to avoid being charged the full course fee, applications must be  **canceled** via email [blearegistrar@cjtc.state.wa.us](mailto:blearegistrar@cjtc.state.wa.us) no later than **September 26, 2011**.  
**No exceptions will be made.**

**Attendance:** 100% attendance is required. The student will be required to pass a written test with a minimum score of 80%. Certificates of completion will be awarded to those students who successfully complete the course.

**Attire & Equipment** **Required equipment:** Please bring the following items with you to class.  
• Tactical uniform

**Needs:**

- Ballistic vest
- Load-bearing vest
- Physical training attire (Day one physical testing)
- Gas mask and carrier (properly fitted and function tested)
- Helmet
- Muffs or plugs for hearing protection
- Shatter-resistant glasses for eye protection
- Flashlight
- Mirrors
- One intermediate rifle or sub-machine gun, one handgun, and at least three magazines for each
- Ammunition: handgun-500 rounds; intermediate rifle/sub gun-500 rounds
- Students should bring any other agency equipment that would be used on a SWAT call. **No NFDD's or chemical munitions please.**

**Optional equipment:** Portable radios, knee pads, elbow pads.
