Student Instructions

Participants are requested to report on **Tuesday October 11, 2011 at 0800** to the **Richland Police Range**. Generally, class times will be from 8 AM -5 PM daily but may change as necessary. Schedules will be made available on the first day of class.

Lodging, Travel, and Meals: Travel and meals will be the responsibility of the participant or his or her agency. **There will be no reimbursement for expenses.**

Costs: Agencies will be billed after the course is completed for all four days \$400:

- Day 1 & 2 (Handgun 2015) fee is \$200.
- Day 3 (Rifle Component 2024) fee is \$100.
- Day 4 (Shotgun Component 2028) fee is \$100

Note: If the agency fails to cancel this application or the applicant is a “no-show,” the agency **will be** charged \$200.

Attire: Suitable clothing for range training in an outdoor environment.

Entry Qualification: N/A

Attendance: In lieu of attending the entire course, participants may elect to attend only those portions of the course that is specific to the weapon they instruct. Certificates of completion will be issued for each weapon.

Emergency Contact: Attendees should advise their families and department of how to reach them in the event of an emergency. **Capt. Taylor, Richland PD 509-942-7363**

Testing : Participants must pass a Marksmanship Qualification specific to the weapon they instruct. Certificate will be issued for each weapon.

Documents: N/A

Liability Release: All participants, as a condition of course attendance and participation, will be required to sign a liability release. If the participant does not bring the form with them, additional forms will be available on the first day at the beginning of class.

Ammunition: **Handgun** -300 rounds of handgun ammunition
Patrol Rifle - 200 rounds of rifle ammunition
Shotgun - 100 rounds buckshot & 50 rounds slug

Equipment Needs: Handgun

1. Department approved Handgun w/ three magazines.
2. Duty belt with agency approved holster and magazine pouches.
3. Duty flashlight w/ backup light recommended.
4. Eye protection and ear protection.
5. BDU type pants w/ cargo pockets.
6. Body armor will be worn while on range.

Patrol Rifle

1. Department approved Patrol Rifle w/ three magazines.
2. Sling for rifle.
3. Eye and ear protection.
4. BDU type pants w/ cargo pockets.
5. Body armor will be worn while on the range.

Shotgun

1. Department approved Shotgun.
2. Sling for shotgun
3. Eye and ear protection
4. BDU type pants w/ cargo pockets.
5. Body armor will be worn while on the range.

Optional Equipment:

1. Clothing appropriate for outdoor training.
2. Knee & Elbow pads.

Injuries: Although instructors will at all times maintain a high degree of care for the safety of all persons attending the school, it must, of course, be understood that neither the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission, nor any of the cooperating agencies can or will assume financial responsibility for injuries or illness suffered as a result of any training received, nor can or will be responsible for any loss to students as a result of damage to their property through fire, theft or other causes. Each participant must understand that this training is at the participant's own risk.

Conduct:

1. 100% attendance required for the portion of the course where a certificate is desired.
2. Students will be immediately removed from this course for unsafe gun handling or negligent discharge of a firearm
