- M.S. or M.A. (in Criminal Justice or related field)
- 2 to 5 years of experience as a criminal justice professional (police, federal, corrections or law)
- 1 to 2 year of teaching experience

- Philosophy of education appropriate to teach in a multi-cultural, multi-ability classroom and advocate for pluralism and social justice
- Experience with innovative teaching of criminal justice and law curriculum which includes strong writing component and group interactions.
