Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows: create nutritional meals to accommodate dietary needs also accommodate residents who are feeders and require tube feeding (snacks in between meals also served)

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows: checking residents every 2 hours or toileting w/ bed side commodes, incontinence care - catheter w/ nurse delegation - colostomy care - using wet wipes each time we change

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows: using gait belts - walker - cane physical therapy exercises - side by side monitoring

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows: using gait belts - walker - cane chair lifts - hospital beds to raise or lower residents prior to transferring

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows: reposition the residents every 2 hours, proper bed elevation and what's comfortable position depending on the care needed,

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows: mouth: brushing teeth flossing denture cleaning needs, hair, shampooing brushing hair etc.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows: dressing techniques to accommodate residents mobility/range of motion help residents to choose clothing that they desire or favorites

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows: using grab bar, shower chair, available to assist w/ hard to reach areas of body due to mobility/range of motion - bed baths

Medication Services

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services: *stroke patients elderly w/ Nurse Delegation etc. as long as met for AFH licensing requirements Hospice - Diabetes - Mental Health Dementia*

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation: *medication - catheter insertion for diabetes, blood sugar testing - tube feeding colostomy - vital signs changing gauge*

Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home. *24/7*
- A resident manager lives in the home, and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: *visiting nurse only w/ Dr. order*
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: *visiting nurse only w/ Dr. order*
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: *24/7*
- Awake staff at night
- Other: *Provider available for residents that need care 24/7*

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING STAFFING

Cultural or Language Access
