Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

Monitoring to partial support.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

Prompting and incontinence support.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

Monitoring to partial support.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Monitoring to partial support with two person transfer and use of hooyer lift.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Monitoring to partial support.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Perform oral hygiene, prompt to wash hands prior to eating, change clothes, comb & cut hair as needed.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

Monitoring to partial support.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

Monitoring to partial support.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

House's ability to provide services vary based on the current make up of residents.

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. (WAC 388-76-10430)

Self administration. All medications are bubble packed by pharmacy.

Medication administration of topical ointments and creams, eye drops.

Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home.
- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: **Registered nurse available only for nurse delegation**
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: _____
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: **Level of staffing support dependent on assessed needs of clients. Home staffing hours are daily from 7am-9pm**

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING STAFFING

Home has an overnight person present in the home but not awake.

Cultural or Language Access

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING CULTURAL OR LANGUAGE ACCESS

L'Arche Seattle is an ecumenical faith-based community. Staff are trained in American Sign Language.

Medicaid

The home must fully disclose the home's policy on accepting Medicaid payments. The policy must clearly state the circumstances under which the home provides care for Medicaid eligible residents and for residents who become eligible for Medicaid after admission. (WAC 388-76-10522)

- The home is a private pay facility and does not accept Medicaid payments.

Prospective residents are referred through Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) and receive waiver services.

Activities

The home must provide each resident with a list of activities customarily available in the home or arranged for by the home (WAC 388-76-10530).

The home provides the following:

Daily exercise activities in accordance with a person's abilities, art work, annual vacations, retreats, bi-weekly community gatherings, bingo, weekly outings. We support residents by arranging independent activities in the wider community through Metro Access.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING ACTIVITIES

Our activity center provides various activities, candle making, weaving, classes, events outings to parks and museums from 10 am to 3pm daily.
