Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

From set up, cueing and encouragement to 1:1 total feeding. We provide our meals in conjunction with the resident needs and doctor orders.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

Stand by assist for safety to total assistance. Equipment: grab bars, urinal, bed pan, bedside commode.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

Stand by assistance for safety to total assistance. Equipment: cane, gait belt, walker.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Stand by assist for safety to 1 to 2 persons to total assist. Equipment: transfer boards, trapeze bars, floor to ceiling pole, hoist lift, emergency response call button.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

From minimal to total assistance. Equipment: cushions, hospital beds, pressure mattress.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Stand by assist with verbal cues and encouragement to total assist to promote good personal hygiene and appearance.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

From verbal cues and prompts to total assistance.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

We assist with verbal cues needed to complete care or to use equipment appropriately to total assistance. Equipment: grab bars, shower bench, roll in shower chair.

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. We administer medications in compliance with WAC. The caregivers are trained and delegated to perform medications administration and treatments in compliance with WAC.

We work closely with resident family, physician and pharmacy to ensure medication needs.

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services:

RN management and supervision. Palliative and Hospice care, home doctor visits, in home labs and x-rays services, visiting nurse, occupational therapy, physical therapy and mental health therapy as indicated.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

Administration of medications, non-sterile dressing changes, urinary catheterization using clean technique, ostomy care in established and healed condition, gastrostomy feedings in established and healed condition, blood glucose monitoring and insulin administration.

Staffing
