Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

cooking, cutting up foods, reminders of healthy foods to eat.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

reminders to use restroom and will do peri care.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

helping resident on uneven ground and outdoors on snowy or wet surfaces

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

helping resident in and out of bed, chairs or vehicles.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

some assistance is available for special circumstances such as temporary illness or injury.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

assist resident with showers, hair washing, brushing teeth, shaving, denture care, nail clipping

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

assist resident in or out of clothing as needed. Tying shoes, zip zippers, button up.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

be with resident, wash and dry resident as needed or cue resident with reminders. Hair care.

Medication Services

Staffing
