Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

Eating assistance ranges from cuing and monitoring to total assistance.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

Toileting assistance ranges from cuing and monitoring to total assistance.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

Walking assistance ranges from cuing and monitoring, to a one person assist.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Transferring assistance ranges from cuing and monitoring, to a one person assist.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Positioning assistance ranges from cuing and monitoring to a one person assist.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

Medication Services
