Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

- > **Remind you to eat and drink, and occasionally help you cut up your food, prepare food and beverages for you, and bring them to you.**
- > **Feed you, if you occasionally need to be fed.**
- > **Feed you on a routine basis, if you are unable to feed yourself.**
- > **Assistance with other form of feeding and eating such as tube feeding.**

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

- > **Provide stand-by assistance.**
- > **Steady you as you use the toilet or adjust your clothing.**
- > **Physically help you to and from the toilet or bathroom.**
- > **Help you with incontinent products and occasionally help to clean you.**
- > **Provide urinary catheter care (indwelling, external/condom) cleaning and changing bag.**
- > **Provide routine ostomy care, site maintenance and changing bag.**
- > **Provide care for bowel and bladder incontinences.**

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

- > **Provide stand-by assistance as you walk or move about in the house.**
- > **Physically help you walk, or move about in the house.**
- > **Assist with pushing you in the wheelchair.**

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

- > **Provide stand-by assistance and steady you, while you transfer.**
- > **Routinely provide assistance while you transfer into and out of your bed or wheelchair.**
- > **Transfer on to and off of a toilet or shower chair.**
- > **One-person physical assistance with transferring on and off the bed and of toilet or shower.**

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

- > **Reposition for comfort.**
- > **Turn every 2 hours for bed bound resident or resident unable to turn themselves.**

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Encourage you to comb your hair, brush your teeth, shave, wash your face and hands and apply make-up, and occasionally provide standby assistance and steady you while you perform these activities.

> Set out your personal hygiene and grooming items.

> Help you with grooming tasks such as brushing your hair, shaving, applying make-up or filing your nails.

> Help you with oral care and brushing your teeth.

> Help you wash and dry your face and hands.

> Help you wash and dry other parts of your body

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

> Remind and cue you to put on, take off, and lay out your clothes and occasionally provide stand-by assistance and steadying while you perform these activities.

> Help you put on, take off, and button/buckle/fasten your clothes.

> Dress and undress you if you are unable to do so.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

> Remind you to wash and dry all areas of your body;

> Provide stand-by assistance getting into and out of the tub/shower and steady you as you bathe.

> Physical assistance getting into/out of the bathtub or shower.

> Help washing areas that may be hard for you to reach, such as your back or feet.

> Total bathing assistance if you cannot bathe by yourself.

> Bed baths as required.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. (WAC 388-76-10430)

The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is:

>Includes reminding you to take your medications, handing to you and/or opening for you the medication container, and putting the medications in your hand.

> We have a licensed nursing staff available to administer directly, or to supervise the administration of types of medications listed below by delegated nursing assistants.

> Medications such as oral and topical medications, eye/ear/nose drops.

> Glucose monitoring and administration of insulin injections by delegated nursing assistants.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING MEDICATION SERVICES

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services:

We provide intermittent nursing services, including:

- > **Diabetic management as specified**
- > **Non-routine ostomy care.**
- > **Administration of health care treatments such as SVN's, tube feeding**
- > **Other nursing services- please ask the owner/Provider if we provide other nursing services you may need, such as minor non-infected wounds or preventative skin care.**
- > **We use nursing assistants under the delegation of a registered nurse to provide some authorized nursing services.**

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

- > **Non sterile wound care, catheter management, ostomy care.**

Staffing

- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

Medicaid
