Dear Provider:

The Department completed a full inspection of your Adult Family Home on December 17, 2019 and found that your home does not meet the adult family home licensing requirements listed below.

The Department staff who did the inspection and provided consultation:

Consultation:

WAC 388-76-10146 Qualifications Training and home care aide certification.

(2) The adult family home must ensure all adult family home caregivers, entity representatives, and resident managers hired on or after January 7, 2012, meet the long-term care worker training requirements of chapter 388-112A WAC, including but not limited to:

(d) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid; and

WAC 388-112A-0710 What is CPR/first-aid training? CPR/first-aid training is training that meets the guidelines established by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). Under OSHA guidelines, training must include hands on skills development through the use of mannequins or trainee partners.

Review of Staff C's employee file showed he completed on-line cardiopulmonary(CPR)/first-aid 02/16/18. The Entity Representative stated he only worked on-call, would schedule him for a class and would not have him work until he completed the class.

WAC 388-76-10146 Qualifications Training and home care aide certification.

(2) The adult family home must ensure all adult family home caregivers, entity representatives, and resident managers hired on or after January 7, 2012, meet the long-term care worker training requirements of chapter 388-112A WAC, including but

not limited to:
(e) Continuing education.

WAC 388-112A-0610 Who is required to complete continuing education training each year, how many hours of continuing education are required, and when must they be completed?

(1) Adult family homes.

(b) If exempt from certification as described in RCW 18.88B.041 , long-term care workers must complete twelve hours of continuing education by their birthday each year.

(i) Unless voluntarily certified as a home care aide under chapter 18.88B RCW, the continuing education does not apply to registered nurses and licensed practical nurses licensed under chapter 18.79 RCW.

(ii) Continuing education requirements under subsection (1)(b) of this section do not apply to certified nursing assistants and persons with special education training and an endorsement granted by the superintendent of public instruction, as described in RCW 28A.300.010 .

Review of Staff A's employee file showed her birth date was [REDACTED]; however, her continuing education for 2018-2019 was not completed until 08/24/19.

WAC 388-76-10165 Background checks Washington state name and date of birth background check Valid for two years National fingerprint background check Valid indefinitely.

(1) A Washington state name and date of birth background check is valid for two years from the initial date it is conducted. The adult family home must ensure:

(a) A new DSHS background authorization form is submitted to the department's background check central unit every two years for each individual listed in WAC 388-76-10161 ;

Review of Staff A's employee file showed her background check expired 10/20/19, and was not renewed until 12/02/19. There were no negative findings.

WAC 388-76-10415 Food services. The adult family home must:

(1) Ensure that the safe food handling training requirements of chapter 388-112A WAC are met; and

Review of Staff B's file showed her food handling training was done on-line 08/20/19; however, the training was not DSHS approved. Staff B completed DSHS approved food handling training during the inspection.

WAC 388-76-10750 Safety and maintenance. The adult family home must:

(1) Keep the home both internally and externally in good repair and condition with a safe, comfortable, sanitary, homelike environment that is free of hazards;

Observation on 12/12/19, at 9:40 AM, showed the ramp was narrow with edges that extended about two inches above the ramp edges, and the entry to the adult home had two open places on either side of the front door that posed trip hazards. At approximately 10:30 AM, the Entity Representative said the home was 'grandfathered' in and said she would fix the areas.

You Must:

- Begin the process of correcting the deficiency or deficiencies immediately; and
- Complete correction as soon as possible.

You Are Not:

- Required to submit a plan-of-correction for the deficiency or deficiencies found.

The Department May:

- Inspect the home to determine if you have corrected all deficiencies.

You May:

- Ask for an informal dispute resolution meeting, according to the attached "Informal Dispute Resolution" instructions; and
- Ask questions and provide written information to help clarify or dispute the deficiencies.
