Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

- Evergreen AFH is providing assistance from minimum (set-up only) to total 1:1 feed. we also provide assistance with tube feeding. We work with Doctor and/or Nutritionist and follow their recommendations in terms of diets. We provide 3 nutrition meals/day and snacks and monitor hydration

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

- We assist our residents with all their toileting needs, one or two caregivers are available as needed for up to 6 residents. we provide continence training.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

- We encourage mobility, but assist residents when assistance is needed. we encourage use of gait belts/cane/walker/wheelchairs when needed

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

- When assist residents with transfers, from minimal assistance to total assist. Our caregiver are trained to use Hoyer lift when required.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

- Positioning is important for all residents; Our caregivers turn and reposition residents often to ensure comfort, safety and prevent pressure ulcers.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

- Our caregivers are encouraging residents to participate in self hygiene but when help is needed we provide assistance from set-up to total assist depending on the residents' needs.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

- Residents have the right to choose what they want to were and we are here to provide assistance as needed from set-up to total assist.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

- We provide assistance with bathing from set-up to total assist depending on residents' needs. we provide walk-in shower.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is:

- RN delegation for each resident in order to provide assistance with medication administration/management as ordered by the doctor.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING MEDICATION SERVICES

- We are working closely with the Doctors and Pharmacy, we monitor and report any side effects and changes in the residents' health.

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services:

- Assistance with all ADLs, Medication administration. We are able to setup Home Doctor appointments, in-home Home Health visits, Mental Health RNs Physical/Occupational Therapy/ Podiatry services / Hospice / in-home Xray and Lab draws.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

- Medication Administration, Tube feeding, Ostomy Care/ Foley catheter care/ daily Vital signs

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING SKILLED NURSING SERVICE AND NURSING DELEGATION

- We work closely with our Nurse Delegator to ensure that we provide the best care for our residents; we keep up to date with continuing education and training.

- We have been providing high quality and specialized care for seniors with Dementia and Mental Health for over 14 years.

Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home.
- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: As Needed
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: As Needed
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: 24/7
- Awake staff at night As Needed
- Other:

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING STAFFING

Cultural or Language Access

Medicaid

Activities

- Activities are provided based on residents' preferences and abilities: We provide: Music Therapy, Games, walking in the nearby park, crafting, reading (travel librarian), art projects, birthday parties, holiday celebrations, and more.
