**Personal Care**

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows: *Monitor for adequate fluids assisting the residents on a spoon feeding. Provide snacks in intake between meals, special diets that includes low sodium, diabetic or puree diet as needed.*

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows: *provide total assistance, from cueing and monitoring.*

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows: *with CNA or caregiver. stand by assistance, wheel chair or walker*

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows: *provide physical assistance with gait belt or handle bars to transfer.*

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows: *Laying down reposition every 2hrs.*

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows: *Trim nails once a wk am + pm care during bath, dental brush daily, clean dentures non shower day goal is to be clean dry + odor free*

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows: *Assist to decide weather appropriate clothes like comfortable + presentable clothes daily laundry.*

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows: *Assist in/out of the shower. Do not leave alone. Assist on washing, shampooing, drying, lotion + continue monitor skin + report any abnormalities to RN.*

**Medication Services**
