Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

We provide assistance from cueing to total feeding assistance to resident's who is also requiring altered diet such as pureed, soft, mechanical soft and also thickened consistency. We also try our best to accommodate our resident's food preferences.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

We provide assistance from monitoring, cueing, and moderate to total assistance. Resident's incontinence is not an issue in our home because we try our best to try bladder training

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

We provide cueing, monitoring, 1:1 assistance with assistive device such as cane, walker

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

We provide cueing, monitoring, moderate to total assistance with 1 person (stand pivot, hoyer lift transfer)

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

We provide assistance from cueing, monitoring, and total assistance in turning/repositioning every 2hrs and as needed.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

We provide assistance from cueing, set up, monitoring to total assistance with personal hygiene.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

We provide assistance with dressing from cueing, set up to total assistance.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

We provide assistance with bathing from cueing, set up, monitoring to total assistance.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. (WAC 388-76-10430)

Home Health Agency RNs usually provides skilled nursing services to the home as ordered by resident's medical provider. Also home works with Nurse delegator and Home provider is RN.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

medication administration such as oral, topical, eye drop, inhalers and insulin, glucose monitoring

Staffing

- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.
