**IMPOSITION OF CONDITIONS ON A LICENSE AND
IMPOSITION OF CIVIL FINE**

Dear Mr. Navarro

This letter constitutes formal notice of the imposition of a civil fine for your adult family home, located at **9826 24th Ave Seattle**, by the State of Washington, Department of Social and Health Services, pursuant to the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 70.128.160 and Washington Administrative Code 388-76-10940.

The civil fine is based on the following violations of the RCW and/or WAC found by the department in your adult family home. These and other deficiencies are more fully described in the attached Statement of Deficiencies report completed by the department on August 5, 2013.

WAC 388-76-10400(4) Care and services. **\$2,000.00**

The provider failed to follow required skin care protocol to prevent skin breakdown.

The conditions are based on violations of the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) and Washington Administrative Code (WAC) regulations found by the department at your adult family home. These and other deficiencies are more fully described in the attached Statement of Deficiencies report completed by the department on August 5, 2013.

WAC 388-76-10400(4) Care and services.

The provider failed to follow required skin care protocol to prevent skin breakdown.

The department has determined that the following conditions shall be placed on your adult family home license:

- The licensee, at her own expense, will contract with a nurse consultant to assist the provider develop and implement a system ensure skin care needs are met. This will include but is not limited to:
 - How to promote healthy skin;
 - Recognizing, preventing, and protecting residents with skin breakdown;
 - Identify which residents are at risk for pressure ulcers;
 - What to do if skin problem is identified i.e. proper positioning, reporting;
 - Update the care plan.
 - Developing strategies for working with residents with patterns of behavior that are resistant to care.
 - Train all staff
- The consultant must be hired by September 6, 2013.
- The licensee will provide the consultant with a copy of the August 5, 2013 Statement of Deficiencies.
- The consultant will be available to answer questions from the department.
- The licensee must post the license with the enclosed Notice of Conditions of Operation in the adult family home in a location accessible to residents and visitors.

You may contest the imposition of conditions on a license and the imposition of civil fine by requesting an administrative hearing. The Office of Administrative Hearings must receive your written request for a hearing within twenty-eight (28) calendar days following receipt of this letter. A copy of this letter and a copy of the enclosed Statement of Deficiencies must be included with your request. Send your request to:

If no hearing is requested, the fine is due twenty-eight (28) calendar days after receipt of this notice. Please remit a check for **\$2,000.00** payable to the Department of Social and Health Services. The check should be sent to:

If payment has not been received within twenty-eight (28) days after receipt of this notice, interest will begin to accrue on the balance at the rate of one percent per month. If you do not submit a hearing request or make payment within twenty-eight (28) days, the balance due the department will be recovered.

As provided in RCW 70.128, you may request an informal dispute resolution review of enforcement actions initiated in response to a Statement of Deficiencies report. During the informal dispute resolution process you also have the right to present written evidence refuting this action. A request for informal dispute resolution review will not change the deadline for you to request an administrative hearing. Informal dispute resolution review by the department is not binding in an administrative hearing.

The written request should:

- Identify the citation and/or enforcement action that is disputed;
- Explain why the home is disputing the action;
- Indicate the type of dispute resolution process you prefer (direct meeting, telephone conference or documentation review); and
- Be sent within 10 working days of your receipt of this notice.

Plan of Correction/Attestation

You must:

Return the plan/attestation, on the enclosed report, within **10 calendar days** after you receive this letter. Include the following in you plan for each deficiency:

- The date you have or will correct each deficiency; and
- Provide a signature and date certifying that you have or will take corrective measures to correct each cited deficiency. Send your Plan of Correction to:
