Dear Provider:

The Department completed a full inspection of your Adult Family Home on November 19, 2018 and found that your home does not meet the adult family home licensing requirements listed below.

Consultation:

WAC 388-76-10198 Adult family home Personnel records. The adult family home must keep documents related to staff in a place readily accessible to authorized department staff. These documents must be available during the staff's employment, and for at least two years following employment. The documents must include but are not limited to:

- (2) Staff orientation and training records pertinent to duties, including, but not limited to:
- (c) First aid; and

On 11/15/18, the home did not have certificates of first aid training for the provider, Staff A and C. The renewal training was completed; however, only certificates for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) were put into the file.

WAC 388-112A-0600 What is continuing education and what topics may be covered in continuing education?

- (1) Continuing education is annual training designed to promote professional development and increase a caregiver's knowledge, expertise, and skills. DSHS must approve continuing education curricula and instructors. The same continuing education course must not be repeated for credit unless it is a new or more advanced training on the same topic. However, long-term care workers may repeat up to five credit hours per year on the following topics:
 - (d) Food handling training;

WAC 388-112A-1000 Which trainings require department approval of the curriculum and instructor?

(1) Except for facility orientation training under WAC 388-112A-0200 (1), the department must preapprove the curriculum, including delivery mode, and instructors for all training required under this chapter.

Employee file review on 11/15/18 found: Staff B's certificate for specialty training in dementia showed the provider was the trainer; the provider stated she was not certified in the new curriculum. The provider, Staff A and Staff C had certificates of training in food safety from an online program. The program was not on the department's approved instructor list and not from a county health department.

You Must:

- Begin the process of correcting the deficiency or deficiencies immediately; and
- Complete correction as soon as possible.

You Are Not:

- Required to submit a plan-of-correction for the deficiency or deficiencies found.

The Department May:

- Inspect the home to determine if you have corrected all deficiencies.

You May:

- Ask for an informal dispute resolution meeting, according to the attached "Informal Dispute Resolution" instructions; and
- Ask questions and provide written information to help clarify or dispute the deficiencies.
