**Personal Care**

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

**The home would provide residents with feeding and special diets(diabetic).**

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

**The home would provide toileting and pericare every 2 hours and as needed.**

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

**The home would provide 1 assist with walking and if needed with walker.**

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

**The home would provide 1-2 assist with transferring.**

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

**The home would provide turning every 2 hours and as needed.**

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

**The home would provide assistance with am and pm care, pericare, brushing teeth, and cleaning dentures.**

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

**The home would provide assistance with dressing and undressing of residents.**

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

**The home would provide showers, bed baths, and sponge baths as needed.**

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

**Medication Services**

(WAC 388-76-10040)

- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:
