WAC 388-76-10430 Medication system.

- (1) If the adult family home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications.
- (2) When providing medication assistance or medication administration for any resident, the home must ensure each resident:
- (c) Medication log is kept current as required in WAC 388-76-10475 ;
- (d) Receives medications as required.

This requirement was not met as evidenced by:

Based on observations, interviews, and record review, the Adult Family Home (AFH) failed to ensure 1 of 4 residents (Resident 3) received their medications as ordered and accurately documented medication not provided on the medication administration record (MAR). This failure placed all residents at risk of complications from not receiving medications as ordered.

Findings included...

During medication review with Staff A, Provider, and Staff B, Caregiver, on 03/18/2025 at 3:10 PM, observation of Resident 3's blister pack (Blister packs, also known as bingo cards or bubble packs, are the most commonly used medication packaging in long-term care facilities, offering individual medication dose); did not show the two medications/supplements of Vitamin D3 (used to treat and prevent bone disorders) and Melatonin (a hormone in your body that plays a role in sleep) contained within the blister pack.

Observation of the medication cabinet on 03/18/2025 at 3:12 PM, did not show the medications/supplement for Resident 3.

Record review of Resident 3's MAR dated, "030125-033125", on 03/18/2025 at 3:45 PM, showed on page 1 that the prescription of "Vitamin D3 ... (FAMILY SUPPLY)" was signed for as provided from "03/01-03/17/2025". Under page 2 of the same MAR it showed, "Melatonin... (FAMILY SUPPLIES)" and this being an as needed.

In an interview on 03/18/2025 at 3:45 P.M., Staff A reported that this signing on the MAR for the Vitamin D3 "as given" to Resident was an oversight and that the "family stopped paying for it".
