### Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

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1. EATING	
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If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows: *assist residents physically by spoon feeding if needed, cue and prompting in chewing. Prepare 3 square meals and between meals snacks. Special diet if needed.*

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows: *Bars for handle, seat resizer on toilet. Perineal care and cleaning. Kept dry and clean at all times. Assist in changing diapers if needed.*

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows: *cue and prompt in walking in the most safely manner.*

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows: *cue and prompt residents in safe and proper transfers*

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows: *Inform residents when positioning in chair and in bed from side to side every two hours or when necessary*

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows: *use perineal care, soap and warm water, dry + clean at all times. Powder or lotion of Fraix choice.*

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows: *Assist in dressing in the morning and evening. We do laundry.*

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows: *Full bath or Bed bath if needed, grooming and oral hygiene.*

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

*All care are given with Tender, Loving + Care.*

**Medication Services**

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. **Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation**

(WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services: *Registered nurse available Nurse Delegation visit regularly. Assist if needed.*

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation: *Mental Health, Post operative Care, Diabetic, Dementia, Catheter Care + DDD*

Staffing

The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:
