Personal Care

Provides cuing, supervision to total assist with toileting - 1 person assist.

3. WALKING

Provides cuing, supervision to total assist with walking - 1 person assist.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Provides cuing, supervision to total assist with transfers - 1 person assist. Our staff is trained to use hoyer lift if needed.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Provides cuing, supervision to total assist with positioning - 1 person assist.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Provides cuing, supervision to total assist with personal hygiene - 1 person assist.
