### Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

#### 1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

The home will provide 3 nutritious meals daily; snack, between meals, assistance in eating, cueing & feeding

#### 2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

The home will provide assistance w/ toilette usage; peri-care, pads replacement (attends)

#### 3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

The home will provide assistance w/ walking to ambulate clients, as stated in client's assessment.

#### 4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

The home will assist clients requiring assistance with w/c to w/c, bed to w/c, w/c to recliner transfers & vice versa.

#### 5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

The home will assist clients with positioning in bed & recliner.

#### 6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

The home will assist clients w/ personal hygiene; combing/brushing hair, shaving

#### 7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

The home will assist clients in need of help w/ putting on; buttoned-up shirts, cueing, TED hose, socks, shoes, slippers, pants.

#### 8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

The home will provide assistance with bathing, apply lotion after bathing, wash back, legs, shampoo hair, drying, monitor h2o temp.

The home will provide any other personal care not listed above, as listed on clients assessment.

### Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. (WAC 388-76-10430)

The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is: The home will assist w/ client's medications & other medical needs, as stated in their assessment & care plan. Medications will be kept in a locked storage in the kitchen by trained caregiver who has proper credentials & training by RN.

#### ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING MEDICATION SERVICES

In order to administer medication to clients, caregivers will have to be delegated by the assigned RN.

### Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services: The home will contact CAREPLUS to schedule for nurse delegation. The home will utilize nurse delegation for residents who are not able to self medicate & requires help with medication administration.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation: The home will contact nurse to provide nurse delegation. Sterile wound care will also be provided.

The home will always follow directions from RN and/or doctor.

### Staffing

(WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.
