2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

Grace Alzheimer's Center provides toileting assistance from cuing and monitoring to total assistance.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

Grace Alzheimer's Center provides walking assistance from cuing and monitoring to a one or two person assist.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Grace Alzheimer's Center provides transfer assistance from cuing and monitoring to a one or two person assist.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

All our bathrooms are equipped with roll-in showers.

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is:

Grace Alzheimer's Ctr provides monitoring oversight for use of all medications and assist the Resident to "Self Administer" medications in compliance with the Washington State Medication Assistance laws, and as ordered by the Physician. When it is determined that a Resident can no longer "Self Administer" their own medicines, Nurse Delegation will be set up to facilitate Medication Administration as required by Washington State Laws. Nurse delegation costs are the resident's responsibility.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING MEDICATION SERVICES

Staff will administer all medication. Medication administration is included in the basic rate.

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services:

Grace Alzheimer's Center does not offer 24-hour skilled nursing services.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

Skilled nursing services shall be provided by a Registered Nurse that is licensed to practice nursing in the State of Washington. Those include: assessments and care plans, nurse delegations, on call visits. The cost of these services are not covered by Grace Alzheimer's Center.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING SPECIALTY CARE DESIGNATIONS

Grace Alzheimer's Center is an Adult Family Home that cares for residents affected with various forms of Dementia and Mental health. The provider and staff members are trained in Dementia and Mental health care. Annual continuing education is also obtained in Dementia and Mental health care.

Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home.
- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing

coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: Once a week and as needed plus 24hr on-call
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: _____

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING STAFFING

All staff at Grace Alzheimer's Center have CPR and First Aid training.

After 3 years of consecutive private pay, we will accept Medicaid reimbursement with a 3 month notice.

Activities

The home must provide each resident with a list of activities customarily available in the home or arranged for by the home (WAC 388-76-10530).

walking (indoors/outdoors), ball/balloon toss, baking (already prepared), folding laundry, writing letters, drawing, scrapbooking, dish washing/drying, gentle music/classical, reading out loud, photo albums- old photos, watching old movies/musicals, brushing/curling hair, manicures, short car drives, board games, bird houses, gardening (flower pots), etc.
